### The Jubilee Year of Mercy

We return to school in the Year of Mercy. The Mercy Year is the year Pope Francis invites all of us to follow the merciful example of God by inviting us to live like Jesus and to spend the year refusing to judge or condemn anyone. To do this requires us to choose, at all time, to offer love and forgiveness rather than judgement and criticism.

W. Phillip Keller says "Mercy is to care, and care very deeply about one another. It is to care to the point where we are prepared to be involved with the sufferings and adversities of others. It implies that I am prepared to put myself in the other person's place. It means that I shall try to really understand why they behave as they do, even though it injures me. It is a willingness to walk a mile in the other person's shoes before I criticise his/her conduct.

It is the extension of good will, help, forgiveness, compassion and kindness to one who may not seem to deserve it."

"We long for mercy as Pope Francis says .... But mercy can be a hard word to swallow. We all want mercy shown to ourselves when we mess up or even sin, but have you ever noticed how mercy isn't the first thing that comes to our mind when others sin against us, or cause us problems, or get in our way? We talk about mercy, but at the same time set up incredible hurdles to be overcome for someone to show they "deserve" that mercy. This creates the terrible situations of hardness, isolation, and sorrow in our world. Maybe you have felt them yourself? The call of Jesus pushes each of us to never stop at the surface of things, especially when we are dealing with people. We are called to look beyond the surface, to focus on the heart to see how much generosity and goodness everyone is capable of. No one can be or should be excluded from the mercy of God." Let us choose this year to be inclusive .... Let us look for the best in every one and if someone fails us or lets us down, let us choose to forgive and to give them a chance to start again not just 7 times but as Jesus says 77 times 7. May your presence bring light, love and mercy to others this year.

### **Summer Uniform**

Please ensure that your child's name is CLEARLY written or sewn onto each item of school clothing, particularly the jumper and hat. You will need to check these regularly to ensure your child has their own belongings and return any items that have another child's name and that have been accidentally picked up.

Reminders:

- Hairstyles for both boys and girls should be neat and tidy and reflect accepted standards. Shoulder length hair or longer is to be tied up. Parents are requested to refrain from allowing children to dye their hair during school terms. Scrunchies or ribbons need to be in school colours (maroon or white). The Principal reserves the right to decide the acceptability of hair styles.
- A watch and / or necklace with a Christian symbol may be worn. A signet ring may be worn. No nail polish, tattoos, makeup may be worn during school hours.
- Girls – one pair or set of earrings, that is, only one stud or sleeper in each ear lobe.
- Boys – may not wear earrings during school time.

#### **Girls**

- Maroon and white check dress
- Short white socks
- Black lace up school shoes

#### **Boys**

- Grey shorts
- Grey shirt with motif
- St. Munchin's grey school socks
- Black lace up school shoes

The grey school shirt needs to be tucked in.

### **School Fees**

Accounts detailing 2016 school fees will be sent home with your child next week. You may call in to the office to pay your account annually or over three terms by cash or cheque. If you do choose to pay your account by term please note that payment must be made in the last week of the term. St Munchin's utilises the services of the Catholic Development Fund as a means of paying your school fees by direct debit. Please ask for an application form from the office.

### **Children with Medical Requirements / Medic Alerts**

A medical form has to be completed for **all children** who need to take any form of medication or have a medical condition of which the school staff needs to be made aware. If you have kept medication in the office from last year, please call in to check the expiry date.

### **Parent Contact Details**

The school needs to successfully communicate with families, especially at short notice and it is important that family contact details are kept up to date. On many occasions, we encounter difficulties in trying to contact parents or guardians by telephone. Home and mobile numbers are often out of service, mobiles switched off, or message bank facilities lacking. Occasionally work situations have changed making day time contact by phone or email difficult. ## Rainbows Counselling Services

Rainbows is a peer support program for children living in a single parent or step family, or children who experienced a significant change and loss in their life (such as but not limited to: death of family or friend, moving country or state, illness or disability).

When a change takes place in a family, whether it is death, divorce or separation, it has a profound effect on the whole family. Children, as well as adults, grieve the loss of a loved one or place that was once part of their everyday lives.

Grief is a normal human reaction to a significant loss. Frequently children are not able to express their grief verbally, so it surfaces in their behaviour, school work, as a physical ailment or it affects their emotional development. Even those children who appear to have adjusted well are often struggling inside with different emotions of grief.

The Rainbows program offered at our school provides the guidance children need to work through their grief and move on to the healing process. It helps them to sort through their confusion, deal with their feelings, regain self-esteem and get on with being a child.

The Rainbows Program consists of twelve sessions where small groups of children, in similar age categories, meet weekly with a trained facilitator. Adults, as well as children, are bound by confidentiality, which fosters trust and provides a safe atmosphere.

In 2016 we will be commencing Rainbows in Semester 1. For more information, contact Mrs Manik in 5M.
